### **Senior Report**

Jan spoke on the Senior Report. This season the decision was made to enter two teams into the Hutt Valley U18 competition, with our boys reaching the finals, a fantastic effort.

Acknowledged the Premier 2 Women's team for their outstanding achievements in winning both the Intercity and Wellington competitions.

Premier 1 Men and Prem 2 Men's rebuilding phase and nurturing of younger talent within their respective teams. The Premier 1 Men's attendance at Club nationals was deemed a highlight for the team, introducing them to elite high performance competition. Premier 2 Men attained 3<sup>rd</sup> place in their competition. Presidents team coming in third place this season, still did the business on the diamond.

Once again, as in many seasons a high proportion of our teams represented PCU at national competition. Congratulations are extended to all players. Of note Gene Lutton, Lewis Temarama, Glen Allan and Katie McAndrew all formed part of Wellington representative teams who took out 1<sup>st</sup> place in their competitions.

Te Wera Bishop was once again selected as Young Sportsman (Senior Club) and Katie McAndrew as Young Sportswoman (Senior Club). Congratulations to these two players for this achievement. Te Wera was also reselected in the Junior Black Sox and continues his pathway towards the Black Sox team.

Thank you to all players, coaches, managers, scorers and supporters for your service this season.

In all a successful season for our Senior Club which we hope will continue this season.

### **Junior Club**

PCU had 12 teams participating in the junior section of the club, up 2 from the previous year. Once again coaches and management did a wonderful job providing quality coaching to our children.

A major highlight was the 48 representatives that were selected from PCU for both Western Bays and Wellington competitions - this represents nearly half of our club numbers – a record to be proud of it. All players are congratulated on their selection and achievement.

Dante Makakatea and Terina Higgins were chosen as Junior Sportsperson of the year, both worthy recipients. Terina played for U15, U18 and P2 (PCU) Competition and was chosen as top catcher at the U15 Girls Softball Nationals. Dante plays for the U15 boys team was also selected for U15 and U17 national teams and was honoured with being selected for the tournament team at both tournaments.

The PCU U13 Boys (Bobcats) won their grade coached by Thomas and Fabian Makea and Ross Willis led the U15 boys to a first equal competition win. A fabulous effort by both teams.

PCU maintained its relationship with Russell School by having both an U9 and U11 team registered last season. Tania Russell is thanked for her valuable contribution in the coaching, management and liaison of these teams.

Alan Jones and Gary Rauhihi have provided commentary for both their teams for this season which is included in the report.

Jan thanked coaches, managers, players, scorers for their hard work through last season.

## **Financial Accounts**

Bob Hutchinson spoke to his report, acknowledging the continued support of our sponsors, volunteers and team supporters throughout the season.

In the offseason Bob along with Julie have been working hard with our key stakeholders to produce a strategic plan taking PCU's vision and putting it into writing.

Bob thanked Elizabeth, Julie and Jan for their work with the collection of subscriptions. Last season saw PCU recoup some outstanding debt and allowed us to pay our bills on time. We now have a small amount of income the use of which will be discussed by the incoming PCU Executive.

Bob noted that as part of this seasons' application, NZ Community Trust granted our Premier 1 Men's team a contribution of \$1,000 to be used for their Clubs tournament, unfortunately this arrived too late, the funding has been subsequently returned. An application will be made again this year.

Outstanding subscriptions from the last season remain, those players have been corresponded with. This will be a discussion topic for the incoming PCU Executive.

Bob recommended that if anyone wanted to purchase equipment for players that they do so through the club, we attract a better rate. Payments can be made directly to PCU as reimbursement. No approval will be permitted without the express permission of the Treasurer. Bob will make reference of this on the PCU Website.

## **GENERAL BUSINESS**

### **SNZ**

Dave Render spoke of SNZ's primary focus of working with Coaches, Clubs and Associations. Dave has been employed as the Regional Game Development Officer with SNZ for the last year and has responsibility for the Lower North Island. Dave advised that he is able to assist the Club with the formation of any training that may be required.

There was some concern over coaching offered by SNZ. The accreditation process requires improvement. The level of coaching offered by SNZ is somewhat lacking in parts. There is some belief that SNZ might not have a true picture of current abilities of players/gaps analysis. It was noted that Clubs or Players do not know who SNZ staff are, what their roles are or what they offer to the game.

It is noted that communication from SNZ is poor and requires some improvement. Jan responded that communication is received from SNZ which is filtered through E-News and regular publications on courses on offer. An improvement needs to be made at both Club/Association/SNZ level. SNZ recently distributed a survey of satisfaction which has been forwarded to all PCU contacts – Jan encouraged everyone to give their feedback.

Alex Carter commented that SNZ needs to get into schools, their awareness of the game is poor. Dave agreed that he could work more closely with local schools with PCU's facilitation.

### **In-House Coaching Clinics**

Last season PCU delivered in-house coaching clinics in conjunction with our Premier 1 Men's team – these were well received. It is agreed that the level of knowledge by our Senior coaches is strong – we have the ability to offer this knowledge to our players and that we must see a repeat of this coaching this season.

### **Strategic Planning**

In the off-season a Club Strategic Plan has been prepared to give the Club future direction and to also meet the needs of our key stakeholders and sponsors.

Bob spoken on meetings with key stakeholders (WSA, PCC, MCGT, & RSA) in the off-season which have largely seen a positive response. One of our key objectives is to see a major upgrade of facilities at Porirua Park. A grant application has been made as part of our annual request to MCGF. We have also approached WSA for funding, this has not yet been approved. One of our long term goals is to have lighting at Porirua Park so it can be used as an alternative to Fraser and Hataitai. This park does not just service PCU, but includes other local clubs namely Toa, PCI and Old Baileys. If this upgrade is approved, it will ultimately benefit all clubs including our Association.

### **Registration Day**

Alan Jones raised the possibility of junior registration day. This will be discussed by the incoming committee.

### **Appointment of Senior Coaches/Managers**

Appointment of senior coaching and management staff have been confirmed for this season. This information is loaded onto the PCU Website. Joe Temarama had made a recent application to coach the U17 boys team, his application has been accepted.

## **WSA**

Jan briefed PCU members of WSA items of interest:

## **WSA**

- Jan will be reapplying to be part of the WSA Executive this season.
- Interchange rule still up for review – seeking clarity at AGM
- WSA AGM Monday 16<sup>th</sup> August, 7pm at Sport Wellington. Jan Ryan, Bob Hutchinson, Julie Elliott and Steve Basher will be in attendance. PCU receives 2 votes at the AGM – these will be exercised by Bob, Julie or Steve.
- Explored possibility of having two Premier 1 Men's team – this was not seen by Executive as adding any value to current competition considering that last season's Prem 2 squad didn't win competition. Not pursued.
- Player registration (WSA requirement) – all players registering under PCU banner will be required to complete information this season (player contact details).
- WSA outstanding debtors must be paid before the season starts – we have a couple of these, these people have been reminded. They will not be permitted to play until financial with WSA. Contact Clare Lundon, WSA Treasurer for detailed information.

## **Porirua RSA**

- Met with RSA Committee (President, VP, Treasurer and Secretary) – positive relationship, supportive of PCU
- Keen to gain as much patronage as possible to RSA – we support this.
- We need to look at having a PCU Club night – prior to Christmas but this needs to be supported by our members not just one team.
- Request that if we have non members that we sign in. Very much applies if you intend to play poker machines – if you don't sign in and you win you will not receive money.
- Children are welcome – please remember that they must respect the premises and not run around disturbing RSA members. 7pm rule applies.
- We need to support the RSA, they support us. Especially when we have games at Porirua Park please use the opportunity to invite your opponents back to our base.
- Jan encouraged PCU players and members to join the RSA, the fee is very nominal. Roger (President) of RSA mentioned that they might be able to offer a card to PCU (not for membership) but as an access facility. If this proceeds then PCU's logo will be included. There is a small fee of \$1.00. This card does not constitute membership.

## **Use of Porirua Park or Other Facilities (Grounds)**

- Preseason training maybe underway in the next few weeks for teams. If intention is to use any Porirua City Council facility then permission must be obtained. Porirua Park is out of bounds until game day – 30 October 2010. PCC advise Ascot Park is an option but must be booked. Contact Jan and will approach PCC for permission.

# 2010-2011 Senior Club Report

This year, PCU entered our twenty third season. Our senior club fielded six teams, the majority of whom participated in the Wellington Softball Association competition. This is a reduction of one from the 2009/2010 season with our Presidents team opting to take a break from the diamond.

Coached by current Black Sox Squad Member, Thomas Makea, our PCU U17 boys team entered the U17 in the latter part of the competition (they were dominating the U15 game and it was proving very unchallenging). They were not able to win this competition due to the late entry, within in the short period of time became a force to be reckoned with, next season this team will take ownership of this competition from the first pitch. Congratulations to Thomas, Julie Elliott (manager) and Kara Makea (scorer) for their hard work with this squad.

Once again, PCU entered two teams in the U18 level in the Hutt Valley Friday night competition. The U18 boy's team coached by Premier One Men's player, Sam Bishop reached top four with a significantly changed team from the 2009/2010 season. The PCU U18 girls coached by Gary Rauhihi and Jan Ryan came in third equal with Te Aroha. The Hutt Valley competition is fast paced but as a Club it is not our primary focus; it is merely a stepping stone to progressively working our younger players through to more focussed Premier Wellington and Intercity competitions.

Premier 2 Women – PCU were defending champions from the 2009/2010 season, this year coming in runners up to Tawa Softball Club. This season is heavily dominated with young players, some who are still learning the ropes – this year was about development and regrouping with our goal for the future season to return to Premier One. Porirua Women's softball was put back on the map with Coach Alex Carter's appointment as Head Coach of and Katie McAndrew's recruitment into the New Zealand Girl's Development Team.

Premier 2 Men – Coached by long-serving Porirua Softball member, Bob Hutchinson this team had a combination of young and longer serving players. As with the Premier women's team, this team is in a redevelopment phase providing players the opportunity to take the next step up into more focussed competition. Despite the fact that the draw was not always consistent for our Premier 2 Men's team, they got on the diamond and did their job. Our gratitude is extended to Bob Hutchinson for his perseverance, he is the backbone of this team and without him it would not have functioned this season.

Premier 1 Men – The men once again proved to be highly competitive on the diamond attaining 3<sup>rd</sup> equal in the Intercity Competition. They punished many competitors on the diamond which shows their passion, drive and determination in the absence of a "recognised" pitcher. Five players from this team were selected to represent Wellington in the National Fastpitch Competition. Another highlight was the success at the Doreen Dalton tournament reaching the final but going down to long term opponents, Miramar 5 – 4.
